THE BAPTIST MINISTERS.

(Maritime Baptist.)

The old Botskill church, of Green- wick, N. J., of which Rev. Gordon B. Keirstead (formerly of St. John, is now pastor, will celebrate its one hundred and fiftieth anniversary on May 8.

Rev. C. T. Clark, of Houlton, Me., occupied the pulpit at Bridgetown, N. S., on last Sunday. Mr. Clark is one of our own and his departure from these provinces a few years ago was a distinct loss to our work.

An extensive revival is being enjoyed at White Head, Grand Manan. The pastor, Cleveland I. Wilson (Lic.), is a brother of Rev. J. Clement Wilson, late of St. John. We hope to see him again with a New Brunswick regiment. Thirty-three candidates were baptized on Easter Sunday and two others were received by letter.

Rev. A. G. Baker, one of our Canadian Baptist missionaries in Bolivia, is now enjoying a year of furlough in the home-land after nearly seven years of arduous service in South America. He, with Mrs. Baker, and their son, arrived in Toronto, March 27th. We hope that he may find it possible to spend some part of his furlough in the maritime provinces that our churches may receive further knowledge of our Bolivian mission.

A notable work of grace has been in progress in connection with the First Church, Moncton. On Easter Sunday the pastor, Rev. Bowley Green, gave the hand of fellowship to 120 new members. The pastor has been his own evangelist, and has sustained his reputation as a most effective Gospel preacher. Many will rejoice because of this wonderful harvest of souls that has been garnered.

We have learned with deep regret that R. M. Hobson has tendered his resignation at Shediac, N. B. Since he came among us he has rendered a splendid service to the Kingdom of God both as a lay preacher and by his generous gifts to the Lord's work.

The liquor dealers of North Sydney are at present traveling a rocky road. Some of the most troublesome boulders in their pathway have been strewn there by Rev. G. W. Schurman, fearless and militant pastor of the Baptist church in that town. A short time ago about \$80,000 worth of liquor was seized by the authorities. As a result of the temperance crusade inaugurated by Mr. Schurman, the leading liquor dealer in North Sydney has promised to stop all of his business and has countermanded shipments which were en route from Montreal and Scotland.

The new government in this province contains one Baptist, and, as far as we know, only one. Dr. Roberts, who is a member without portfolio, belongs to the Main street church, of this city. Some years ago, before the exacting duties which fill the time of a busy physician made it impossible, he took an active part in the work of the denomination. For years he was president of the B. Y. P. U. of the Main street church, and was also vice-president of the Maritime B. Y. P. U. He is a staunch temperance man, and in him the prohibitory law will have an unwavering friend.

Rev. Joseph T. Hutton closed his work at Clark's Harbor, N. S., on April 1, after a pastorate of nearly four years. Of his experience there he writes: "I shall always look back upon my stay at Clark's Harbor as having been most happy. The kindness of the people has always been unstinted. May I now thank the many friends for their kind tokens of goodwill and friendship, given to me last week. I received in all the sum of \$91.50, besides other gifts." Mr. Hutton came to us from England, where he held the pastorate of one church for fourteen and a half years. Though he lost both his arms by an accident many years ago, he has proved capable of performing the duties of a pastor. His present address is McBray's, Cape Sable Island.
