

## ANGLICAN CHURCH EASTER MEETINGS

Restoration of the railways in connection with rail rates of 1914 and previously. Pilot services (steam) and light ships. Frost proof and export warehouses in connection with terminal facilities. Taxation of government properties, also revision of tax exemptions. Preferential duties on goods entering Canadian ports only. Revival of Dominion Exhibition grant. Appointment of a Deputy Minister of Fisheries with Maritime Bureau. Trans-Atlantic freight and mail services—including summer services from Maritime ports. Privileges to Canadian fishermen at Canadian ports (outfitting, etc.). Survey of manufacturing conditions in the Maritime Provinces.

Harbour management—what system is most beneficial. The conference will probably take place towards the latter part of the month. In the meantime, the Halifax Board of Trade has asked the St. John Board of Trade to file their subjects for discussion.
