DROP IN COMMODITY PRICES—STILL GOING ON IN U. S. New York, Nov. 30—Continuance of the downward readjustment of the commodity prices remains a conspicuous feature, last week's recessions in the extended list of wholesale quotations compiled by Dun's Review numbering 80, as against only 10 advances. More irregularity in the grain markets, wheat and rye showing early improvement under the influence of reports that Europe would soon begin active buying, but later on losing all of the gain. Corn, oats and barley were weakened by some liberal marketings. In live meats, beef and hogs eased off in response to rather free offerings, while sheep were depressed by relatively larger arrivals. Weather conditions resulted in a slightly better demand for provisions, but price changes were not particularly important and about offset each other. Scarcity of fresh eggs sent the best stock up close to record figures, while some advances were established in high-grade butter and these were very firmly held. Quotations on iron and steel continued to recede, and weakness again predominated in the minor metals, tin being especially easy. Announcements of further price concessions in textiles was not expected and the yielding in hides and leathers has been extended, although there is hardly enough buying power to really test the market, and prices are more or less unestablished. In rubber, the reactionary tendency has continued.
