

WORN OUT, BIRD ALIGHTS ON A SHIP 900 MILES OUT AT SEA.

Victoria, B. C., May 11.—Almost exhausted from its long flight, a bird of the plover species picked out the Nipon Yusen Kaisha liner Tajima Maru as a haven of refuge as the big steamship was plowing her way across the Pacific for this port. The liner was about 900 miles out from Victoria when the feathered visitor settled helplessly on the boat deck. Flying aimlessly above the broad expanse of the ship the bird had sought invitation for something to settle upon in order to rest its weary wings and it eagerly accepted the accommodating vessel to save itself from destruction.

The bird was picked up by a member of the ship's crew. It proved very tame and displayed no inclination to resume its flight.
