Willard Deposits \$10,000.
New York, April 12.—Jess Willard has deposited \$10,000 to guarantee his appearance in the ring against Jack Dempsey on July 4. Promoter Tex Rickard made this announcement here yesterday. He said he probably would announce the date of the fight within the next ten days or two weeks.
Rickard said he still hoped to hold a match in the east, although he announced he had three western sites available. He had not seen Willard while in the west, but understood he was well advanced in his training.

Differences Adjusted

Chicago, April 14.—Jess Willard, Jack Hurley and Tom Jones, at one time his manager, had a peace conference on Saturday and settled their differences. It was reported that the two managers settled for \$10,000 claims they sued Willard for in New York. They charged at Willard arbitrarily terminated a contract which still had several months to run.

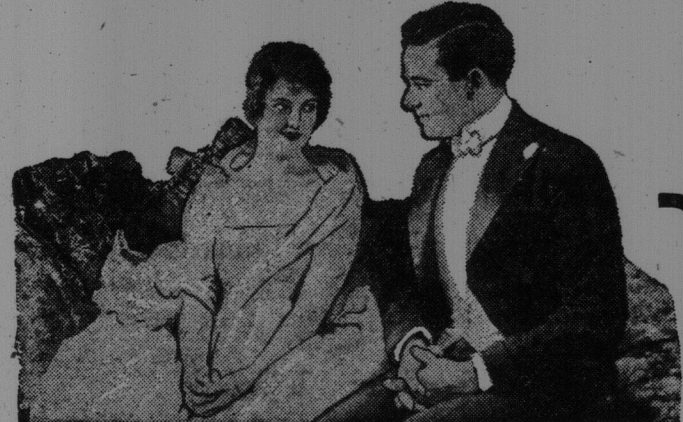

SETTLED ON BASIS THEY REQUESTED

Clemenceau's Announcement
To French Deputation

MATTER OF REPARATIONS

Says Allies Have Reached Agreement on This and Also Relative to the Sarre Basin, But Not Without Overcoming Difficulties

Paris, April 14.—Premier Clemenceau yesterday heard a deputation of the radical Socialist group which called upon him. The deputation was headed by Deputy Rene Renoult, who set forth that the group considered it of great importance that the league of nations should be organized, theoretically and practically, in such a way as to prevent in future any attempt against the security of the world and the independence of its people. The group said its spokesman, demanded no less hopefully the granting of immediate material guarantees that France should be protected so far as possible from any fresh aggression. To reach this end the group considered two things necessary—a strongly organized frontier and the disarmament of Germany, the permanency of which should be secured by continuing control.

Concerning reparations, the minimum requirements formulated by the group comprised the placing of the coal mines of the Sarre Basin at the disposal of France, while it contended that complete reparation must be obtained for all damage to persons and property and provision made for the payment of all war pensions from enemy funds.
