The expected strike amongst the mill men of North End which it was thought would come to a head last night or this morning, has not yet materialized, and it is understood that there has been a further extension of one week in connection with the matter. All the mills were in operation today. On account of this being what is known as a "running day" in most of the plants, the feeling was that if a strike occurred it would take place today. There is a very strong feeling amongst a large number of the mill men, pondsmen, and raftsmen, all of whom are directly interested in the astrike if it is possible, and negotiations with the manufacturers to this end are hoped for. Dealers and trades men throughout North End are vitally nerested in the matter, as there is much speculation concerning the effect in general business should a strike occur. The number of men who would eaffected by it is several hundred. Large catches of shad are being made bout the harbor, while the river steamers re bringing down fairly heavy quantices caught in the upper parts. A few almon are coming, the number increasing now. Prices up to the present have een very high.
