MILL STRIKE MATTER GOES OVER FOR ANOTHER WEEK

Hope of Many That it Will Be Averted—
Land Purchase at Public Landing—
Bride-Elect Leaves For West to Wed
E. J. Mahoney

The expected strike amongst the mill men of North End which it was thought would come to a head last night or this morning, has not yet materialized, and it is understood that there has been a further extension of one week in connection with the matter. All the mills were in operation today. On account of this being what is known as a "running day" in most of the plants, the feeling was that if a strike occurred it would take place today. There is a very strong feeling amongst a large number of the mill men, pondmen, and raftsmen, all of whom are directly interested in the matter, that the number of men who would be affected by it is several hundred.

Large catches of fish are being made about the harbor by the fishermen from along Strait Shore, and about Indian-town harbor, while the river steamers are bringing down fairly heavy quantities caught in the upper parts. A few salmon are coming, the number increasing now. Prices up to the present have been very high.
