

### Daily Hints for the Cook

FROSTING.

One and one-half cups sugar, scant 1-2 cup butter, 1-2 cup sour milk, 1-2 cup chocolate dissolved in 1-2 cup boiling watter, 2 eggs, 2 cups flour, flavor to taste, 1 teaspoon soda, pinch of salt.

Butter frosting: One cup confectioner's sugar, 1 tablespoon butter, 1 tablespoon milk, 1 tablespoon coffee or cocoa, 1-4 teaspoon flavoring. Mix well with spoon, then beat until creamy with silver fork. If done right will be like whipped cream.
