He has been twelve years in the missionary work in Japan and has for the time being given up his work there and accepted a commission in the imperial army as one of the officers in charge of the Chinese construction battalions in France.

L. A. Buckley, head of the soldiers' of the soil movement in New Brunswick, is of the opinion that the production of food in the province will be greatly increased during the coming summer through the assistance rendered the farmers by the boys. Last night the Telegram learned upon good authority that in the case of an unmarried man between the ages of twenty and thirty-four all that is required of him, if he has not yet been called for

service, is to carry his registration papers; there is no need of the larger card showing exemption if he has his paper showing that he is registered. It is no concern of the dominion force whether he has exemption papers or not. The registrar, however, supplies the dominion constables with the list of defaulters and then the former can place under arrest the defaulters as they are caught.

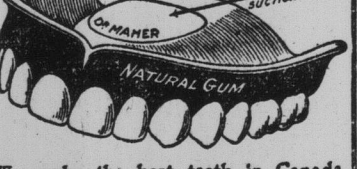

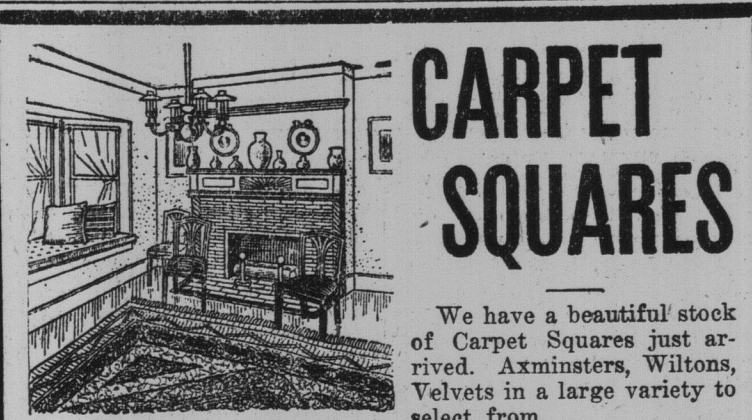

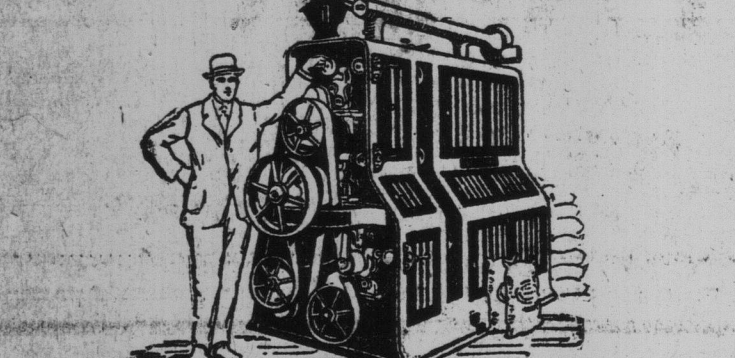
