

THE DIOCESAN SYNOD.

The Amalgamation of the Synod and Church Society.

Special Meeting of the Synod for the Purpose of Adopting Canons.

A Committee Appointed to Draft Resolutions Touching the Death of C. W. Walden.

TUESDAY'S SESSION.

A special meeting of the Diocesan Synod of Fredericton opened in the school room of Trinity church on Tuesday morning of last week for the purpose of considering and adopting canons, etc., made necessary by the amalgamation of the Synod and Diocesan Church Society.

The Lord Bishop of Fredericton presided, and there was a large attendance of both clerical and lay representatives.

The meeting opened with the usual devotional exercises, led by His Lordship. The secretary, Rev. O. S. Newnam, having certified that the requirements of the constitution had been fulfilled by the insertion of the usual summons in the Royal Gazette and the sending of the proper notices, the Bishop proceeded to explain the object of the meeting of Synod. His Lordship said it was called for the purpose of considering the canons and a bill providing for the sale of Church or Glebe lands at other times than was permitted under the old act. It had been hoped that his honor the Lieutenant Governor would be able to be present to introduce the bill. He was, unfortunately, unable to attend. Then T. C. Allen was chosen to do that work, but his physician had forbidden his leaving home. His Lordship went on to point out that the bill was intended to provide for the sale of church lands in parishes where there was no rector in charge. There were two lots of land which could be disposed of at any time after the act had been amended. They were being occupied and would be lost to the church without the change contemplated. The occupier of one lot was willing to buy, provided the act was a proper title. He hoped the bill would be adopted and sent to the legislature for enactment. (Applause.)

The rules of order were suspended, and Ven. Archdeacon Brigstocke moved the following resolution, which was seconded by Rev. J. de Soyres and adopted: "That Rev. Jos. Smith, formerly rector of Westford and Rev. Alfred Bacham be given seats on the floor of Synod."

Geo. A. Schofield, in introducing the canons drafted by the committee of Synod, explained that very few of them were new. The majority of them were re-drafts of the regulations, etc., so that little change was contemplated. He submitted the canons, which were printed, and moved that the first Canon 20, be taken up section by section, considered and adopted.

The first section of Canon 20 read as follows: "The EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE. 1. The executive committee shall consist of the bishop of the diocese, the bishop coadjutor, the dean and archdeacons, if any, the standing committee, the rural deans of the several deaneries, the secretary and treasurer of the Synod, and twelve clergymen and twelve laymen elected by the Synod, which laymen need not be members of the Synod."

Objection was taken by Rev. Mr. Lloyd to this section. He did not believe in the appointment of laymen on the executive committee who were not members of Synod. He moved in amendment: "The executive committee shall consist of the bishop of the diocese and all clergymen resident in the diocese who are duly licensed by the bishop, and 24 laymen being members of the Synod or otherwise duly qualified for election on such committee, to be annually elected by the Synod, together with the secretary and treasurer of the Synod."

A. H. Hanington seconded the amendment, speaking strongly in support of it. Mr. Justice Hanington did not think the Synod could make laymen members of the executive who were not members of Synod.

Rev. W. H. Sampson opposed any change in the constitution of the executive, and said he would vote for the amendment. Sheriff Sturdee said this was in

ally no change. Laymen came to the society years ago, and representing churches were made members of the executive, and continued as such although they ceased to hold positions as representatives.

Rev. de Soyres was opposed to the change proposed. The first section of the canon was a change from the popular and democratic system to a basis of centralization. He spoke eloquently and strongly in favor of the amendment.

In closing the debate, Geo. A. Schofield said he had always been an opponent of amalgamation. But, as a loyal son of the church his opposition must cease. Mr. Lloyd proposed to put 70 clergymen on the committee. The section of the canon under consideration contemplated putting 30 clergymen on it and 12 laymen. The committee was to be elected. It was simply proposed to give the Synod the right to elect somebody other than members of the Synod to the committee. It did not compel the choice of outside men by any means. He urged the adoption of the section.

The amendment was lost by a vote of 48 to 12. Rev. S. J. Hanford moved, seconded by Rev. A. G. H. Dicker, that the words "which laymen need not be members of the Synod" be stricken out of the canon. It was carried.

Rev. W. O. Raymond moved in amendment to the amendment: "That the following words be added to the section: provided they shall be members of the Synod of the Diocese of 1897 life members of the Diocesan Church society and otherwise qualified to be members of the synod under the constitution." It was carried.

This was seconded by Rev. J. de Soyres. Rev. J. M. Davenport urged the adoption of the section as submitted by the Synod, and Sheriff Sturdee spoke in support of it also.

Archdeacon Brigstocke hoped the words would not be struck out as it would preclude from appointment on the committee some of the ablest men in the church who had served her for years and years.

Hon. Judge Hanington did not think the synod should have the right to elect any one they saw fit to the committee. It should be qualified in some way.

Rev. Leo A. Hoyt desired to see the words left out of the section.

Rev. H. Montgomery favored the section in its entirety. It was only permissive, and this synod should not bind future synods.

Rev. J. de Soyres made another appeal against the passage of the section as it stood.

A. H. Hanington suggested that if it were ever found necessary to elect men outside of the synod the canon could be changed. The laymen on the executive should be chosen from among the representatives sent to the synod by the churches.

Rev. A. D. Dewdney did not think it advisable to have anything in the canon which would make the people inquire why they were there. People would ask what the qualifications of the men were who were on the committee and not members of the synod.

Rev. Dean Partridge was going to vote for the striking out of the last few words in the section. He would do so on principle. He thought it a dangerous precedent to permit anyone to legislate for a body of which he was not a member.

Rev. W. O. Raymond made a few remarks in support of his amendment.

Rev. J. Roy Campbell favored the section as it stood.

Geo. A. Schofield said section 3 of the bill set forth that all life members of the D. C. S. existing on 31st Dec, 1897, being otherwise qualified to be members of the synod under the constitution shall be considered ipso facto duly qualified for election at any time as members of any or all the boards or committees which may hereafter be appointed by the synod. Why then object to the latter part of the section.

Both amendments were put and lost, and then the synod adjourned for dinner.

AFTERNOON SESSION. The synod met at 2:30 o'clock. Mr. Justice Hanington moved the following amendment to the first section: "That after the word 'members' in the last line the words be added 'but must be qualified to be elected members.'" This was seconded by Rev. A. G. H. Dicker.

Rev. G. E. Lloyd moved in amendment to Judge Hanington's amendment. The executive shall consist of the bishop of the diocese, the dean, and archdeacons, if any, the standing committee, the secretary and treasurer of the Synod, and twelve clergymen and twelve laymen elected by the Synod, which laymen need not be members of the Synod."

Mr. Lloyd said it might almost be taken for granted that the synod had no legal right to elect laymen to its committees who were not members of the synod.

Geo. A. Schofield took the point of order that the synod having voted not to strike out the words "which laymen need not be members of the synod," Mr. Lloyd's motion was out of order.

A. H. Hanington held that Mr. Lloyd's amendment was in order, and the bishop decided that it was.

Mr. Lloyd, continuing, said the section made the committee consist of 25 clerical votes and 12 lay.

Judge Hanington said Mr. Lloyd now argued against the section because it put 25 clergymen on the executive and only 12 laymen. In the morning Mr. Lloyd advocated making it up of all the clergy (some 79 in all) and 24 laymen. Mr. Lloyd must have forgotten what he said in the morning. Some of the speakers had a mistaken idea as to the duties of the executive. It would have nothing to do with the financial affairs of the church. He could not understand why any warfare was waged against the rural deans. They represented the various deaneries and had a better knowledge of their affairs than any one else. Why should Mr. Lloyd wish to put the secretary and treasurer (who were not necessary members of the synod) on the executive if he wanted none but members on it.

A. H. Hanington seconded Mr. Lloyd's amendment.

Rev. J. de Soyres asked if there was a quorum of clergymen and laymen present, and was informed that there

was in the morning. The secretary said he would not state positively now without calling the roll of the Synod. Mr. de Soyres thought it would be well to make sure that such a change in the constitution was not made by a large number of clergymen.

Mr. Schofield, while he did not doubt but what there was a quorum present, said it should be sufficient to know that there was a good representation of the members of synod in attendance.

Mr. Lloyd's amendment was lost, 54 to 32. Judge Hanington's amendment was then put and carried by a vote of 52 to 12.

Section 1 was then adopted as amended. Section 2. The clerical and lay members of the committee elected by the synod shall be chosen by ballot at each annual meeting of the synod, and shall hold office until the next annual meeting of the Synod of the Diocese.

This was amended by the addition of the following words: "or until others are elected in their stead."

Section 3. Five clerical and five lay members of the committee shall form a quorum for the transaction of business. Section 4. The committee shall meet once an hour and place and on such day as may be determined by the committee, to be held on the 1st of March, June, July and October in each year as may be directed by the bishop, the bishop coadjutor, or the standing committee.

This was amended by the insertion of the words, bishop's commissary, after the words bishop coadjutor.

Section 5. Special meetings of the committee may be summoned by the bishop, the bishop coadjutor, the bishop's commissary, or the standing committee, to meet at such time and place as they shall direct. Section 6. The committee shall elect a secretary, who shall keep the minutes of the meetings, issue notices of the same, and perform such other duties in connection with such committee as the committee shall direct.

Section 7. The committee shall have and exercise all such rights and powers in and connected with the management, control and disposal of all lands, real estate, and every other kind, now or hereafter vested in the synod, and with respect to the common seal, as the synod could or might have or exercise when in session, subject to article 4 of the constitution, and shall also have and exercise all such other rights, powers, functions, and duties as may be vested in such committee, by any canon or regulation of the synod.

It was amended by the insertion after the word "and" in the third line of the words "real estate, moneys, funds, stocks, and all other property of every kind and description, which may be held by the synod, together with the management, control and disposal of every kind, now or hereafter vested in the synod, and with respect to the common seal, as the synod could or might have or exercise when in session, subject to article 4 of the constitution, and shall also have and exercise all such other rights, powers, functions, and duties as may be vested in such committee, by any canon or regulation of the synod."

Section 8. The executive committee shall present a report of their proceedings during the year at the annual meeting of the synod.

Section 9. The committee shall elect a secretary, who shall keep the minutes of the meetings, issue notices of the same, and perform such other duties in connection with such committee as the committee shall direct.

Section 10. The committee shall have and exercise all such rights and powers in and connected with the management, control and disposal of all lands, real estate, and every other kind, now or hereafter vested in the synod, and with respect to the common seal, as the synod could or might have or exercise when in session, subject to article 4 of the constitution, and shall also have and exercise all such other rights, powers, functions, and duties as may be vested in such committee, by any canon or regulation of the synod."

Section 11. The committee shall have and exercise all such rights and powers in and connected with the management, control and disposal of all lands, real estate, and every other kind, now or hereafter vested in the synod, and with respect to the common seal, as the synod could or might have or exercise when in session, subject to article 4 of the constitution, and shall also have and exercise all such other rights, powers, functions, and duties as may be vested in such committee, by any canon or regulation of the synod."
