"I appeal to you to find some ways and means to get him off the football team, so that he may have the necessary time to study, attend lectures, and by so doing graduate in his final examinations."

To this letter the university authorities replied: "When the standing of a scholar is uniformly good, it is impossible for the university to take action in such cases. If a parent desires that his son shall not pursue football, he must persuade him through other means. Just so long as his scholarship is maintained at the proper standing the faculty has no control over the student's action in athletics."



IN SUIT CASE

ANOTHER ARREST

Dr. McLeod of Back Bay District Held.

BOSTON, Nov. 3.-A brief conversa-BOSTON, Nov. 3.—A brief conversation by long-distance telephone and the scene of developments in the famous suit case mystery shifted from New York back to Boston. As a result of the brief talk between Chief Inspector William B. Watts of the Boston bureau of criminal investigation, who is now in New York, and Detective Captain Joseph Dugan, at police headquarters here, Dr. Percy D. McLeod, a reputable physician of the Back Bay district, was arrested on the charge of performing an illegal operation on Susan Geary, the Cambridge girl whose dismembered body was found in two suit cases in the waters of Boston harbor.

Tonight, while the authorities admit that other arrests may be expected soon, they say that the case is practically completed and that it no longer remains a mystery.

Through the confessions of Crawford and Howard, the two men arrested in

and Howard, the two men arrested in New York yesterday, the authorities received evidence which in their opinion warranted the arrest of Dr. McLeod this afternoon. It is alleged that Dr. McLeod was called into the case after the first operation was performed in a McLeod was called into the case after the first operation was performed in a Tremont street office, and that he performed a second operation of a desperate nature in a vain attempt to save the life of the young woman. Miss Geary failing to recover, it is alleged that Dr. McLeod, in an effort to conceal the crime, dismembered the body. These dismembered parts were placed in two suit cases and a small bag, and, according to the confessions of Crawford and Howard, dropped by them into the harbor.
