THE STUDENT CONFERENCE AT NORTHFIELD.

The Northfield Student Conference will be held at East Northfield, Mass., July 1 to 10. This Conference has been held upon the invitation of Mr. D. L. Moody and members of his family each summer since 1886 under the direction of the Student Department of the International Committee of Young Men's Christian Associations. Its purpose is to build up the Christian life of students and to train them by leadership of the varied organized Christian work of their institutions. It is attended annually by about 700 men from 130 colleges and preparatory schools. The daily program consists of morning and evening platform meetings in the auditorium, normal Bible classes, conferences on college Young Men's Christian Association work and life work meetings on Round Top. The missionary feature under the direction of the Student Volunteer Movement for Foreign Missions is always prominent and consists of normal classes for training in leading home and foreign mission study classes, a missionary institute for the discussion of methods and missionary addresses. The athletics in the afternoons bring out friendly rivalry between the colleges. Among the speakers for this year are Rev. G. A. Johnston Ross of Cambridge, England; Rev. Charles Cuthbert Hall, D. D., of New York; Rev. Anson Phelps Stokes, Jr. of New Haven; Rev. R. A. Falconer, Halifax; Mr. Robert E. Speer, Mr. John R. Mott and S. H. Hadley of New York City.

The delegates are entertained in the buildings of Northfield Seminary, in tents on the Seminary grounds and in Camp Northfield. For information, letters should be addressed to C. E. Boynton, 3 West 29th Street, New City.

NEWS SUMMARY.

Lurcher lightship is to be equipped with submarine bells.

The Montreal conference of the Methodist church has unanimously adopted a resolution and praying that obstacles be removed.

The second German cable from Borkum to New York via the Azores was completed June 1st.

The eighth Maine musical festival opened in the Auditorium, Bangor, Thursday night before an audience of about 1,000 people.

A race riot between white and colored persons occurred in Philadelphia on Monday. Four persons were seriously hurt and a score of others were more or less roughly handled.

The Georgia democratic convention instructed its delegates to the national convention to vote for the nomination of Judge A. B. Parker of New York, for President.

At Brookside, near Truro, a second case of small-pox has developed at the home of the young man who brought the disease from Sydney.

Florence Nightingale has just celebrated her eighty-fourth birthday at her house, No. 10 South street Park Lane, London, and still takes an active interest in charitable work.

Judge Ferguson, of the High Court of Justice of Ontario, is dead. Judge Ferguson was called to the bar in 1863 and practiced in the city of Toronto.

Judge J. N. Ritchie of the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia died on Sunday morning last of heart disease. Judge Ritchie was seventy years of age and was appointed to the bench in 1885.

The government will probably agree to the proposals of Prof. Robertson respecting the creation of scholarships whereby certain teachers may be able to take special courses in nature study at Guelph.

In part of Australia, where the average rainfall is not more than ten inches, a square mile of land will support only eight or nine sheep. In Buenos Ayres the same area, with thirty four inches of rain, support 2,500 sheep.

As a result of a fight on the Sims and Williams plantation at Trail Lake, Miss., John Sims and his manager, named Cato, were killed by negroes, and three of the negroes have been killed also.

In consequence of the refusal of the pastor to admit to their first communion children who had sung anti-clerical songs, a mob of a thousand wrecked the pulpit and overturned the statues in St. Jean's church at Toulon, France on Thursday. A force of police dispersed the rioters.

At Moncton, the first of the batch of Scott Act cases brought against the so-called restaurants came up in the police court. M. V. Paddock, of St. John, who analyzed the seized beer, stated that he found it contained 3.97 per cent. alcohol. Seven other parties are charged with keeping beer for sale.

A German officer has invented an acetylene searchlight which can be carried by one man, and which will illuminate everything within one hundred yards. It is expected to be of great use in searching for the wounded after a battle, and in bridge building at night.

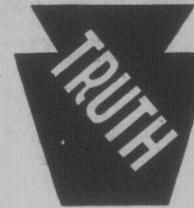
