London, Feb. 21.—The British bark Gulf Stream, from Glasgow April 29th for Tacoma, has been posted by Lloyds as missing.  
Pensacola, Fla., Feb. 21.—Considerable damage was caused by small shipping in the Pensacola harbor early today when a sixty mile gale blew over this part of the Gulf coast. Pensacola was cut off from wire communication for a time. The damage to property in the city proper was small.

## LOCAL.

Police Court.  
In the police court yesterday morning William Peterson, charged with breaking and entering the Church of England Institute rooms and stealing therefrom, was arraigned. Employee of the Institute told of the robbery, and other witnesses told of making an iron bar for the prisoner similar to that found in the rooms. The prisoner was remanded until Friday.

Thomas Birtwistle and John McLaren, who were arrested for drunkenness and disorderly conduct on the ferryboat were fined \$5 each. Six drunks were fined \$5 each.

The Home Reunion Plan.  
The Home Reunion Association, composed of local business men, who subscribed a fund of \$5,000 for the purpose of aiding settlers to bring out their families, met yesterday morning in the Board of Trade rooms to complete their organization. An advisory committee was chosen, consisting of H. C. Schofield, president of the Board of Trade; R. T. Hayes, H. B. Schofield, T. H. Estabrooks and W. E. Foster, with W. E. Anderson as trustee. The money is now available for the purpose for which it was subscribed, and it will be placed at the disposal of the provincial government immigration officials for use as required.

Newcastle Lady Dead.  
Newcastle, Feb. 21.—Miss Isabella Geikie, a well known resident, was suddenly attacked with heart disease on Tuesday while walking along Pleasant street. She fell to the street, and when found some time afterwards was dead. The deceased lady was a dressmaker and resided with her sister. She was highly esteemed, and her death was heard of with regret.

Ellder-Dempster Line str Karama left this port yesterday afternoon on the long voyage to Melbourne, Aus., and New Zealand ports with a general cargo.

Battle Line str Leuctra, Capt Hilton arrived at Newport News last Tuesday from Antwerp for Greenock.

The months of January and February were noted for storms and shipwrecks along the Atlantic coast. The strmr St. Pierre-Miquelon ran into the strmr Renwick off Louisburg last month and the subject is being threshed out in the Admiralty court to determine on whom to place the blame and damages. The strmr Caledonia captured with a cargo of lumber for New York last Saturday week 60 miles off Halifax while in tow of the cable ship Mack-Bennett. The schrs Rhoda and Annie M. Hendry have been missing nearly three months from their ports of departure. The Annie M. Hendry left Turks Island for Liverpool with a cargo of salt. Next we hear the thrilling story of the crew of the wrecked strmr Morrisey who arrived in Gloucester Friday and now Capt McDade and part of the crew of the abandoned Hibernia have arrived in Halifax with a story of hardship and exposure in mid ocean before being rescued by the strmr Glenroy. The extensive ice packs which cover from 20 to 70 miles long and which are found from the Cape Breton coast northwards along the Newfoundland coast make navigation difficult for vessels, several of which are locked in Newfoundland ports by the ice packs. These do not expect to be freed till the last of April. Last month a fleet of American herring schrs were held up on the fishing grounds, necessitating the sending of two U S revenue cutters to rescue them. Along the American coast vessels are experiencing similar difficulties due to the ice and being frozen up in isolated harbors.—Halifax Herald, Feb. 21.

## GENERAL.

McGill is Puzzled.  
Montreal, Feb. 21.—It is now learned that the governors of McGill University are in a quandary. When they launched the campaign for \$1,500,000 which was raised very speedily some time ago, it was arranged that the subscriptions pledged should be paid later. Some of these were paid partly in mining stock, which is now found to be worthless. While they do not doubt the good intentions of the new who subscribed the stock, they are in a dilemma as the projected improvements in the university cannot be carried out unless the subscriptions are made up to the total amount promised.

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
