NICKEL STARTS WEEK WITH EXCELLENT BILL

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

Any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years of age may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry may be made by the applicant or his intending homesteader. Royalty. Duties. A homesteader must reside upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$10 per acre. Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of three years, cultivate 40 acres and erect a house worth \$100.00.
