A fire-proof roof is not so readily made as the walls; yet the asbestos roofing ma-terial, which is employed extensively for roofing purposes, will endure an intense heat unharmed. Perhaps there is no other roofing material now in use that will stand the fury of a raging fire so long as this; yet a roof may be rendered thoroughly fire-proof by first covering the foundation with felting and asbestos, then laying a course of hard bricks in good cement mortar over the entire roof. Brick tiles one foot square would be preferable to bricks. It would be utterly impossible for any fire from an adjoining building to damage the roof when covered by brick-tiles two inches thick.
