lacked the practical knowledge requisite to enable them to administer agricultural to enable them to administer agricultural affairs intelligently. There is one practical farmer (Mr. Perley) in the Executive, while there are four lawyers, and the country will not long continue to suffer the claims of its agriculturists to be ignored in this way. There is no Minister of Agriculture provided for in the bill and it cannot be expected that either the Surveyor General, the Provincial Secretary or the Attorney General (three lawyers) will say they are capable of taking the charge of so important an interest, about which they must know so very little.

The Provincial Secretary said it might
