After alluding to the fact that he had only prepared himself to speak upon the first tablet commemorating Maisonneuve's landing, not knowing that the second was to be erected, he said:—On the 15th October, 1641, De Maisonneuve solemnly took possession, for the associates, of the island of Montreal.
