CAP. XXIV.

An Act for Importing Salt from Europe into the Colony of Nova Scotia in America.

Malbereas Doubts have arisen, whe: Preamble. ther Dis Wajellp's Subjects may I lawfully import Salt directly from any Foleign Polt in Europe into the Colony of Nova Scotia in America for the Uls of the Fishery there, in like Manner as is allowed for the fitheries of New England and Newfoundland, by virtue of an Act of Parliament made in the Fifteenth Bear of the Reign of King Charles the Second: And whereas very confiderable Egablishments have lately been made in the faid Colony by fishermen from different Parts of his Has jesty's Dominions, with a Cliew to carry on the Fishery upon the adjacent Banks; In order therefore to remove such Doubts as asozelaid, and soz the Encouragement of to valuable a Branch of the Commerce of his Wajelly's Subjects, which was one principal Object of the Settlement of this Colony, and of the Encouragement given by Parliament for the Support of such Settlement, Way it please Pour most Excellent Wajesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majetty, by and with the Advice and Concent of the Loids Spiritual and Tempozal, and Commons, in this present 9 U 2 **Parliament**
