An Act for Importing Salt from *Europe* into the Colony of *Nova Scotia* in *America*.



Whereas Doubts have arisen, whe- Preamble.
ther His Majesty's Subjects may lawfully import Salt directly from any Foreign Port in Europe into the Colony of Nova Scotia in America for the Use of the Fishery there, in like Manner as is allowed for the Fisheries of New England and Newfoundland, by virtue of an Act of Parliament made in the Fifteenth Year of the Reign of King Charles the Second: And whereas very considerable Establishments have lately been made in the said Colony by Fishermen from different Parts of His Majesty's Dominions, with a View to carry on the Fishery upon the adjacent Banks; In order therefore to remove such Doubts as aforesaid, and for the Encouragement of so valuable a Branch of the Commerce of His Majesty's Subjects, which was one principal Object of the Settlement of this Colony, and of the Encouragement given by Parliament for the Support of such Settlement, May it please Your most Excellent Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present
