That every Motion, when seconded, ought Reception of to be received and read by the Speaker, except ^{motions.} in the cases provided for by the Rules of this House.

44.

That it shall be the duty of the Speaker, when-Motions conever he shall conceive that a Motion which he trary to Rules. has received and read, may be contrary to the Rules or Privileges of this House, to apprise the House thereof immediately, before the question on such motion is put, and to cite the Rule which is applicable to the case.
