under his hand and seal to nominate and appoint any one or more of the Justices of the said Court of Common Pleas, hereby constituted to sit in the said Court of King's Bench in the place and stead of the Justice or Justices of the said Court of King's Bench who shall be so disqualified from or rendered incapable of sitting as aforesaid, and such Justice or Justices, so nominated and appointed, shall have the same powers and authorities to hear, try and determine such Appeal or Appeals, or cause or causes of error as the Justice or Justices of the said Court of King's Bench, so disqualified from or rendered incapable of sitting thereon, would otherwise have had, and no more. Provided always, that nothing herein-contained shall give power or authority, or be construed to give power and authority to any Justice or Justices of the said Court of Common Pleas, to sit in or to hear, try and determine any Appeal or Appeals, or cause or causes in error in which he or they shall have sat in the Court below.
