With reference to memorandum of the 37th September 1910, I find on File Re. 65911, the report of the late John 0.Nelson, in charge of I.H.Surveys, dated the 35th of New. 1889 on the surveys made during that year. He states with regard to Reserve 106:-

LOBO STATIST

"Mr. Ponton also visited has la Ronge and Montreal "Lake and surveyed a reserve at the latter point for some of " the Indians who last winter signed adhesion to Treaty 6. " At the former Lake a reserve will probably be surveyed "during the coming winter, or perhaps several small reserves, " for the Indians in that visinity who have been promised a " reserve with a lake frontage of forty miles and a depth of "two miles."
