	18-8-40		Flying all day by A.T.S. Heavy rain in p.m. One aircraft landed Malton and one at Muskoka.	
	19-8-40		Class #3 A.T.P. reported at noon, 22 from Fort William, 21 from Malton. The first Yales arrived. Two from National Steel Car, Malton.	
	20-8-40		Overseas draft, 34 airmen left by train for Rockcliffe. 8 more Yales taken into service. 32 U.S. newspaper editors and 8 Canadian hosts visit Camp and see flying display by 24 aircraft. Mess dinner afterwards. Party left by bus at approximately 2200 hours. Lt. Col. A. Ally visited this Station at approximately 1500 hrs.
