Memorandum of Agreement between the General Electric Co.. Pittsfield Works and its employees affiliated with the Metal Trades Council of Pittsfield. Mass.

To the end that harmony should be established in the Pittsfield plant of the General Electric Co., the following agreement is submitted for consideration as a basis for working agreement for one year. Either party to this agreement can withdraw by giving notice of 30 days in writing.

Article No. 1. This agreement is entered into between the General Electric Company, Pittsfield Works, and its employees affiliated with the Pittsfield Metal Trades Council.

Article No. 2. A conference committee consisting of five members shall be appointed or elected by the employees of the General Electric Company, Fittsfield Works affiliated with the Pittsfield Metal Trades Council.

Any matters referred to this committee shall be taken up with Division Supt. Manufacturing Supt., or General Manager.

Article No. 3. (Clause A.) There shall be a committee of one for each department of 50 or less employees. Departments having 75 employees will have a committee of 2. In departments having 125 employees or over there will be 3 members of the committee. No department committee to exceed 3 members in any one department. There will be an allowance of ten employees either way before changing the number of members on a committee. This committee to deal with the Foreman or Livision Supt.

(Clause B.) Referred to Mr. C. C. Chosney. It has been suggested to specify Local Executive Officer instead of Executive Officer's.

Article No. 4. The Company shall not discriminate against any officer or member affiliated with the Metal Trades Council for properly attending to matters pertaining thereto, nor for taking an interest in the welfere of the Metal Trades Council, or any affiliated organizations. It being understood that the duties in connection with the work of the Metal Trades Council is to be done in such a manner so as not to interfere with the work of individuals not a party to the grievance.
