Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 25th ultimo in reference to the opening of the Enderby school.

In reply I beg to say that the Department ~~was~~ regrets at this late date to find that some of the Indians are opposed to this school. At the outset the Indians were quite enthusiastic at the prospect of having a school opened for their children. However, in view of the fact that the equipment has been purchased, it is thought desirable to give the school a trial and you may engage a teacher temporarily, the engagement to be terminable at a month's notice from either party. To a teacher with a certificate or to one with peculiar qualifications that, in your opinion, will enable her to successfully conduct the school a salary at the rate of \$500.00 per annum will be paid. Be good enough to advise the Department promptly should you take action and request the Agent to make regular reports on the work.
