5. Value of direct consultations between Commonwealth Prime Ministers.

In view of the general agreement as to the excellence of existing methods of consultation, it may be asked what purpose is served by direct consultations face-to-face.

The answer is that immediate personal consultations are desirable not to concert policy or to settle definite issues, but to explore one another's minds on matters of general interest: to form personal friendships which contribute so greatly to a proper understanding and appreciation of written communications.
