The first movement made in reference to the building of a new church took place in the year 1889, when it came up for discussion at the annual meeting of that year. A motion was introduced by John Paterson, seconded by Jas. Dickie, that a congregational meeting be called for the purpose of considering the advisability of building a new church.
