

5. Any Member who shall detain a book or pamphlet longer than the time above limited, shall forfeit and pay, to the Association, two cents for each day such book or pamphlet is so detained.

6. If any Member lose or injure a book, he shall make the same good to the Library; and if the book lost or injured be one of a set, he shall pay to the Association the full value of said complete set, and may thereupon receive the remaining volumes as his property.

7. No Member shall lend a book belonging to the Association, to any person out of the dwelling house or counting room of said Member, under a penalty of fifty cents for each offence.

8. Any Member may be allowed the perusal of a book in the Rooms of the Association; but such book must be at once resigned to any Member who may require it for perusal at home.

9. The books marked in the Catalogue with an asterisk (*), and such others as may from time to time be specially designated by the Board of Direction, shall not be taken from the Rooms, except by express permission of the Board.

10. No person, except Members of the Board of Direction, shall remove a book from its place in the Library, without the permission of the Assistant-Secretary.

SECTION VIII.—Of the Reading Room.

1. The Room shall be open every day (Sundays and holidays excepted) from 7 A.M. till 10 P.M., from 1st May till 1st November, and from 8 A.M. till 10 P.M. during the remaining six months.

2. No Newspaper, or other publication, shall be admitted into the Room unless sanctioned by the Board of Direction, or by a Committee entrusted by them with the necessary powers.

3. A list of all the Newspapers, Periodicals, new Books, Books of Reference, and other publications, shall always lie on the table in the Reading Room; also a Book in which Members may enter the title, time, and place of publication, together with the Publisher's name, and the price of any book or periodical which they desire to have added to the Library; and a book in which any suggestion or complaint in reference to the management of the Reading Room or Library may be entered.

4. No conversation shall be allowed in the Reading Room, otherwise than in a whisper; and no person shall be permitted to smoke in the Rooms.

5. Any person injuring any of the Periodicals or Papers placed in the Reading Room, shall be liable to a fine equal to double the cost thereof.

6. No Newspaper or any other publication shall on any account be removed from the Rooms, unless by the officer appointed to take charge of them.

7. Any Member may have the privilege of introducing a friend, *not resident in Montreal*, to the Reading Room, for the term of four weeks; and the names of all persons thus introduced shall be registered in a book provided for that purpose.

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
