Mrs. Mary A. Sadlier, the gifted and beloved authoress, was awarded the Lactare Medal for 1895, by the University of Notre Dame. The presentation was made in the

drawing-room of the Archbishop's palace, April 1st, and was presided over by His Grace the Archbishop of Montreal.

Very Rev. W. R. Harris, Dean of St. Catharines, celebrated in June last the twenty-fifth anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood. Addresses were presented on the occasion from the priests of the Archdiocese of Toronto, from the parishioners, and from the Dean's Protestant admirers in the Niagara District. During the year the Dean has published a history of the Catholic Church in the Niagara Peninsula, his second contribution to the historical records of the Church in Canada.

The Very Rev. Edward Cassidy, Dean of Toronto and Rector of S. Helen's Church, Brockton, after an illness of about fifteen months, borne with much patience and
