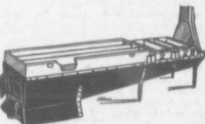

The presses are very light in draft.

Both presses will bale any kind of hay or straw, including timothy, clover, alfalfa, wild hay, shrovetoot, pea vane, etc. The capacity, of course, varies with the material being baled.
