Gruck, together with a new Lift, of the Names of the five Members; then remaining unfiruck, which laft mentioned lift, was read, and is as follows; Michael Wallace, Esquire, Matthew Archibald Esquire, Henry Rutherjord Esquire, James Humpbreys Esquire, and Simeon Perkins, Esquire

Mr. Speaker then called on the setimioner, to nominate one from amongst the Members then prefent, whole names had not been drawn, to be added to those chosen by Lot, to ferve on the faid Select Committee, as also on the fitting Member, to nominate one in like manner, on his Part; ther-upon, the Petitionernamed Thomas Millidge Esquire, and the fitting Member, Mexander Howe, Esquire.

The Names of the before mentioned five Members, and the Names of *Thomas Millidge*, and *Alexander Howe* Efquires, nominated as aforefaid, were called over, and being come to the Table, they were acquainted by Mr. Speaker, that they were a felest Committee, appointed to try the Merits of the contested Election for King's County.

The faid Petitioner, with the Counfel on both fides, were then directed to withdraw.

Ordered, That the felect Committee, do meet To-morrow afternoon, at five of the Clock, in the Committee Room, and that they have Power, to fend for Perfons, Papers, and Records.

Mr. Howe, pursuant to leave given, presented a Bill, to render and make valid, certain Marriages beretofore folemnized before Magistrates, and other lay Persons; and the same was read a first Time.

Resolved, That the Bill, be read a fecond Time.

The Order of the Day being read.

On Motion, the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the Confideration of the Petition of John Clarke Esquire, complaining of an undue Election, for the County of Hants.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Pykc, took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported from the Committee, that the Committee after hearing Counfel, on behalf of the Petitioner, in Support of his Petition; as alfo the fitting Member William Cotnam Tonge Efquire, in his Defence, had come to a Refolution thereupon; which he read in his Place, and afterwards delivered in at the Table, where it was again read by the Clerk, and is as follows.

Rejolved, That it is the Opinion of this Committee, that the Petition of John Clarke Efquire, should be difmified,

The faid Report, and Refolution, being again read, were upon theQueftion, feverally put thereupon, unanimously agreed to by the House.

On Motion of Mr. Howe, ordered, That the faid Petition of John Clarke Esquire, complaining of an undue Election for the County of Hants, be dismissed, and the same was dismissed accordingly.

Then the House adjourned, till To-Morrow at Ten of the Clock.
