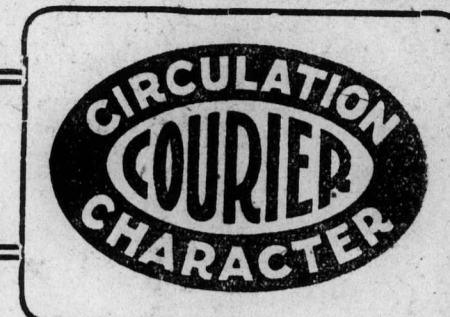

OPPOSITION IN JAPAN TO ASSAIL GOVT. WAR POLICY

London, Jan. 21.—The war policy of the Japanese Government is to be subjected to attack at the session of the Diet, which will be convened shortly, according to advices from Tokio as forwarded in a Reuter despatch from Shanghai. As is customary on the eve of a meeting of the Diet, the political parties assembled yesterday and issued declarations.
