A New Reformatory.
OTTAWA, Sept. 4.—It is stated on good authority that the Government contemplates the creation of a reformatory of the first class, at an estimated cost of \$700,000. The site is selected, it is said, at one of the islands in the Ottawa river, near Ottawa. The prison will be devoted to criminals of tender age, those sentenced for the first time. It is thus proposed to keep entirely separate from the old prisoners, the present system, the former are forced to associate. The reformatory will be for the whole Dominion.
