CRACK NUT SUNDAY.

Method of Mearing a Se Still in Use in England.

"One fine autumn Sunday I attended service in a north of Engli ry church that would have driven a New York preacher clean crazy," said the man who travels. "The congrega-tion didn't do a thing but sit assumd and crack nuts. Fancy a New York minister talking to a crowd of that kind! The modern preacher likes to have things quiet when he talks. It certs him to hear a baby cry or a woman cough or an old man snore. If he is put out by such trifles as these, esting to conjecture what he congregation where everybody brought uts to crack during the sermou.

"Worshipers, it seems, used to do this in England and even in our own states during colonial days. This dis-turbance was not a weekly occurrence by any means. If it had been, the poor preacher would have undoubted-ly left his flock to administer spiritual consolation to suit themselves. But as it happened only once a year he was forced to endure it. This one day which was attended by such remarkable license came the Sunday before Michaelmas day and was called 'crack nut Sunday.' Nobody, no matter how plous he might be, hesitated to avail himself of the peculiar privilege grant-ed him, and men, women and children came to church with their pockets with nuts, which they compla cently cracked and munched during

"It was that kind of a sermon that so impressed me with its oddity. It can be easily imagined that when forty or fifty people get to cracking nuts with all their might the noise is apt to be something terrific, and many times the minister was hard put to it to hear himself think.' That custom, from being regarded with high favor for many years, finally came to be looked upon as a nuisance, and the habit was suppressed, except in a few remote localities, aithough the act of suppression was attended with consid-erable difficulty, so firmly had the nut cracking fever taken hold of the fancy of the people."

To those who have n Escurial the size of the gigantic struc-740 feet from north to south and 580% ers at each corner rising to a height of over 200 feet. Within this monstrons building are the king's palace, a cathe drai, a monastery of 200 cells, two-colleges, three chapter houses, three li-brary buildings, five large halls, six dormitories, three hospitals and over 2,000 other rooms. In order to make St. Lawrence's gridiron complete, the building is built in quadrangular form, with seventeen rows or ranges of mon other at right angles, these forming the gridiron's ribs, the handle being a wing 470 feet in length. The church, which is a part of this vast pile of masonry, is 364 feet long, 230 feet wide with a dome 330 feet in height. It is estimated that the building cost \$50, 000,000.
