A fisherman and his daughter, standing on the shore, were the only ones to witness the death struggle. Bouchard was the first to go down. A minute later a gust of wind put the sea in motion, and Thompson toppled from the cance and sank. The bodies have not been recovered.

even partly looked into it will not appeal to any intelligent voter as anything other than an enterprise that will in fact be more of a detriment to the city than a benefit. I will give a few reasons. In the first place, it is not a safe loan. If it were safe and desirable there are plenty of English, American and Canadian capitalists ready to snap it up. But no one wants to make a loan on a big "white elephant" as security for \$75,000, and the promoters are driven to try to induce the City to accept such security as no one else wants. Then, again, is it not most unbusiness-like for the City to borrow money at 4 per cent. inborrow money at 4 per cent. in-rest and loan it to the Sugar Beet

cohol at a handsome profit.

The other successful factory is surrounded by a community of Holland farmers who were taught in their native country how to grow sugar beets at a profit, and because of this people's knowledge of the business, their industry and the cheap labor the Holland factory is a success.

the million dollar factory at Rochester, where sugar beets tested as high
as 22 per cent. in saccharine matter.
The other factories in Michigan are
not vet failures, but they are

not yet failures, but they are not a success. Many of them are being bolstered up by multi-millionaires until they can get a chance to unload them on some other city, just as the Wiarton factory promoters are trying to unload their big "white elephant" on Chatham. What is elephant' on Chatham. What is true in Michigan and other states will be true in Ontario. The condi-tions are practically the same. Even if the sugar beet factory hap-

Even if the sugar beet factory happens to prove a success, it is not such an enterprise as Chatham should loan money to or in any other way encourage it to locate here. The most of the labor employed is the cheapest kind of unskilled labor, and as the factory runs only a few months in the year this cheap labor floods the town the rest of the year, with the result that good men lose their jobs, and the grocer's bill and landlord's rent is not paid.

Another thing for the ratepayer to consider is that if the proposed \$75,000 is voted, Chatham will have leaned to its limit and could not make a loan to any other enterprisan on matter how much the people de-

make a loan to any other enterprise no matter how much the people desired to have it locate here. As the Ontario Government has already refused to extend the loan limit in the case of Wallaceburg and St. Catharines, it follows also that Chathem will be denied the authority.

Then, again, the tax rate in the city is getting so high as to become a burden on the people, and if the assessed valuation had not been recently raised to the full value of the

cently raised to the full value of the centry raised to the full value of the property the rate would have exceeded 30 mills, and this would put the city in a most humiliating position before the country, in fact almost in bankruptcy. LETTERS STOLEN?

W. T. R. Preston Makes the Charge Before the Public Accounts Committee At Ottawa Thursday.

Ottawa, May 18.—During his examination by S. Barker M.P., before the public accounts committee yesterday morning, W. T. R. Preston, Dominion emigration agent in England, declared that some of his private letters had been stolen from the files of his London office. Some time ago he heard that private letters of his were in the hands of Mr. Griffith, secretary to Lord Strathcona, and he suspected a certain clerk who was much in Mr. certain clerk, who was much in Mr. Griffith's society. On investigation he found that his files had been gone through and mutilated. A file of letters endorsed "Mr. Preston—Private," and two or three letter books had been

He found that on the evening of March 2, 1905, a "gentleman in a dress suit" had been seen coming from his office. He wished to put the matter in the hands of Scotland Yard, but Lord Strathcona demurred on account of the scandal. Lord Strathcona, however, stated that some of the

ever, stated that some of the letters were in his office.

Among the letters taken was one from him to the general manager of the Allans at Liverpool, urging the firm to start a booking office near the new Canadian office in Charing Cross, and if it did not, to give a license to someone to do so; and recommending Leopold as a suitable person.

Connection With Leopold.

Mr. Barker questioned Mr. Preston as to his relations with Louis Leopold, the manager of the Canadian labor bureau. This man's real name, he said, was Leopold Lazarus; later he said that he and Leopold are intimate friends. friends. He became acquainted him in 1902. Leopold coming to him with letters from a prominent German banking firm, in which he had served

"Had he previously been in the em-ploy of the North Atlantic Trading

"I don't know. I don't think so." At the start Leopold had established an agency known as the Farmers' Aux-iliary, designed to assist German emiiliary, designed to assist German emigrants to go to Canada. He first came to Mr. Preston to ask if an arrangement could be made whereby these people's fares could be advanced. No such assistance was given by the Canadian Government. Leopold's remuneration was his commission from the steamship companies Later he entered into the business of helping British emigrants, receiving for these, in addition to his commission, the seven shillings per head given by Canada for agriculturists.


