MORRIS DISQUALIFIED IN FULTON BOUT

Canton, Ohio, Sept. 3.—Carl Morris, of Oklahoma City, was disqualified in the sixth round of his scheduled fifteen round go with Fred Fulton, of Minnesota, for continually butting. Fulton had a big lead when the referee stopped the bout. Morris was mobbed by angry spectators as he left the ring. Morris was not badly hurt. Morris and Fulton were battling for the right to meet Jess Willard, heavyweight champion. The title holder has promised the winner. Fulton tried to leave the arena at the end of the fifth round but was held in the ring by his handlers. Once during the sixth round Fulton started to his corner saying, "I'm not going to fight any more." Referee Hinkel ordered him to continue and Fulton resumed the battle.

Fulton proved the better boxer and was benefited by the clean break rules. Morris took the aggressive in the first round and forced the going throughout.

Morris worked with both hands for the head while Fulton caught Morris coming in with left jabs and left uppercuts to the head. Referee Hinkel said after the bout:

"I was forced to disqualify Morris after I had warned him a dozen times for butting and hitting in the breaks.

SHOWN HIS OWN GRAVE

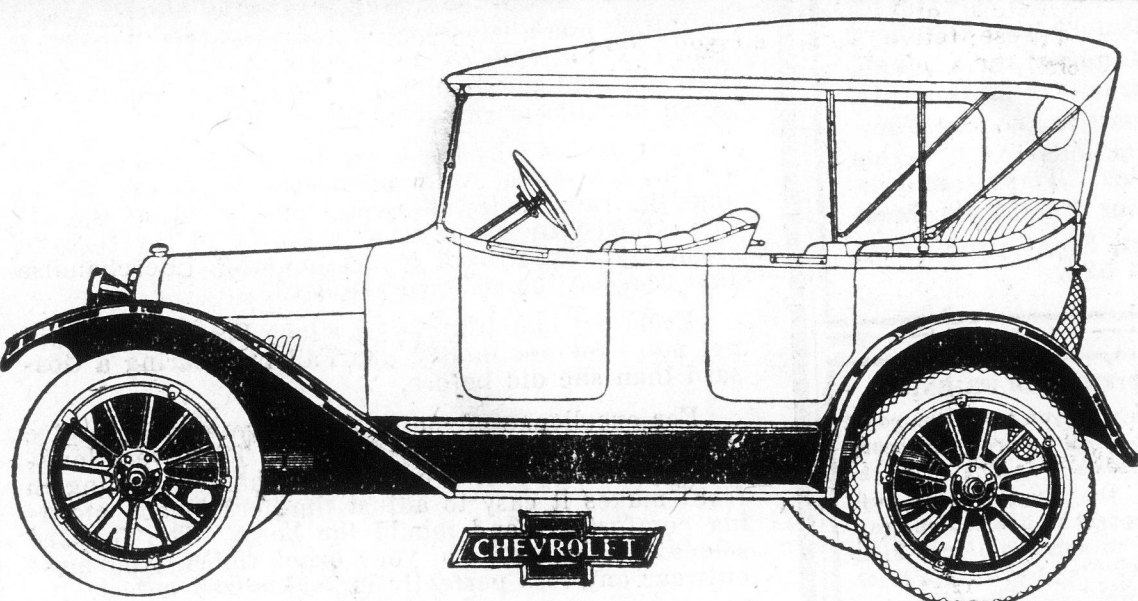
