Clark Was Recaptured on Sunday at Limestone, Me.

Declares He Escaped Unaided—Again Tries to Cheat Gallows

WALKED IN HIS NIGHT CLOTHES

His Feet Were Frosted When He Was Stopped By Exhaustion.

Newman Clark, who murdered Phoebe Bell, a popular 18 years old girl of Grand Falls, N. B., on March 25th, and then put two bullets into his own breast, was recaptured on Sunday afternoon at Limestone, Me., almost twenty miles in a westerly direction through Maine's famous Aroostook county potato belt from Grand Falls, whence he escaped from Dr. Puddington's private hospital some time on Thursday night.

When found by the New Brunswick officers Clark was suffering from bayly frostbitten feet, as all the protection he had had for his feet from the time he escaped from the hospital at Grand Falls early Friday morning until he was found in the stable at Limestone more than 24 hours afterwards, was what came from some pieces he had torn from his nightgown and wrapped about them.

When Sheriff Foster appeared unexpectedly before him Clark again tried to cheat the gallows by attempting to swallow a bottle of iodine which was being used for treating the frostbites, but the officers knocked the bottle out of his hands before he had been able to swallow a large quantity. Shortly before dusk they had him properly fitted out with clothes and started to drive back to Grand Falls.

Walked All Night Until Exhausted.

According to the stories which Clark told at Limestone he had no assistance in escaping from the hospital at Grand Falls, and that the chances would seem to bear out this statement as it appears unreasonable to expect that if friends had helped him to get out of the hospital and across the boundary line they would not also have provided him with proper clothing and taken him to his friends. Instead he says that he walked most of the distance on Thursday night, then remained in hiding in the woods during the day and resumed walking again the following night and finally, compelled by hunger, exhaustion and lack of clothing to stop where he did and take refuge in the horse stall of the Morrell barn, which he found open. That is the story he told at the Morrell home, according to Mrs. Morrell, who declared to "The Gleaner" the long distance telephone last night she did not know what she should have done in the matter, as Mr. Morrell had been away in Carleton Place, Me.

Boundary Rum Runners Furnished Real Clue

(Special despatch to The Daily Gleaner.)

Grand Falls, N. B., April 5.—The finding of Newman Clark in the Limestone district occasioned no surprise to the officers engaged in the case but it was suspected that he had been driven there. Two sleighs, one with two horses and the other a single rig, had been reported to have arrived at Grand Falls from the direction of Limestone about 3 a. m. on Friday and to have almost immediately returned.

It is now believed that these teams, which were believed to have come for Clark were really engaged in smuggling liquor from New Brunswick into Maine; however, it was following up that clue which took Sheriff Foster and Deputy McCreary to Limestone and thus brought about the recapture of Clark.

Nurses at Hospital First Witnesses at Investigation Held By Attorney General

Miss Mallin, the Night Nurse, Tells of Being Awakened by Noise on Thursday Night When She Dozed Off to Sleep But Didn't Think It Was from Clark's Room.

Grand Falls, N. B., April 5.—From J. P. Byrne, Attorney General of New Brunswick, had already commenced his investigation into the circumstances surrounding the escape of Newman Clark from Dr. Puddington's private hospital here when he received word late on Sunday afternoon from Sheriff Foster that the murderer had been recaptured at Limestone, Me.

On Saturday evening, within a few hours after his arrival here from Fredericton, the Attorney General examined under oath Miss Wetmore, the matron, and Miss Mallin, the night nurse, at the hospital here. Miss Wetmore's evidence merely had to do with the arrangements at the hospital. She told when Clark was admitted as a patient and described the ward in which he occupied a bed, William Watson, who had been operated upon, being a patient in the same ward. Miss Mallin, the night nurse, had reported Clark's escape to her.

When Miss Mallin was called she said she had last actually seen Clark about 9 o'clock on Thursday night. Between 12 and 1 o'clock that night she had been in the room to give a hypodermic injection of morphine to Watson, who was recovering from an operation, but did not see Clark then as his bed was encircled by screens. However, she was certain the window was not then open and she was quite sure she heard Clark moving about in his bed at that time. The next time she was in the room was 5 a. m., when she again went in to treat Watson. She also saw her suspicious, so that she turned down the sheets from the top of the bed and found Clark was gone and pillows had been so placed as to make it appear that somebody was in the bed.

The window, Miss Mallin said, was held up by a foot ruler, but where that ruler came from was not divulged. The window was immediately over the roof of the verandah of the building. During Thursday night, the nurse said, she dozed off to sleep for a few minutes and was awakened by a noise, but she didn't think it was in the ward

where Clark was located and therefore did not go in there. Instead, she went into the bathroom but found things all right and thought nothing more of having been awakened by the noise at that time. Miss Mallin was sure that Clark did not escape from the hospital by walking down the main stairs and out the front door, because the main entrance had been locked on the inside on Thursday evening and the lock remained the same way on Friday morning.

The inquiry was then adjourned until this morning.
