Wool Market. London.—The auctions of wool for the fifth series of the critical series amount to 4,920 bales, including 4,000 forwarded direct to spinners. The imports this week were: Victoria, 112 bales; New Zealand, 8,855; Cape of Good Hope and Natal, 3,592; Bremen, 842; various, 1,046. The fourth series will be opened on Tuesday, July 4. During the first five days 59,050 bales will be offered.

British Cattle Markets. London.—Cattle are quoted at 11 to 12 1/2c per lb.; refrigerator beef, 8 3/4 to 8 7/8c per lb.; sheep, 13 to 14c per lb.

New Publications. The opening article in the July Canadian Magazine is a bright, readable article entitled "The Home and Haunts of Joseph Howe." Nova Scotia is also represented by a second contribution, a "Donald" story by W. Albert Hickman.
