Big Timber Deal.

Vancouver, Sept. 23--Sir Thomas Shaughnessy is considering details of the purchase by A. B. Kurtz, of New York, President of the American Financial Securities Company, of fifty-four thousand acres of timber land on Cowichan Lake, Vancouver Island, from the E. & N. Railway Company. The deal involves the construction of twenty-five miles of standard-gauge track and the erection of a sawmill. The money involved is a million and a half and another half million for development work.

TWO SAVED; ONE MISSING.

New York, Sept. 24--E. P. Lawson and his friend, who were supposed to have been drowned in the Hudson River last night, when the launch Madge struck a tow line of the tug Edward H. Meade, were found safe on shore this morning. The third man of the party, a boatman, has not been found. Lawson and his friend got to shore after more than one hour of the water.
