Fort Erie will vote on the proposed bylaw to make the public library there a free one, instead of one to which subscriptions are necessary before having the privileges of a member, about the first week in April. Under the terms of the proposed bylaw, the council will have control over all books in the shelves. At the March meeting the bylaw will be given its first and second readings.

St. Catharines, W. B. Burgoyne,

and H. Moyer and A. H. Trappell

met upon Lincoln County Council

Monday afternoon and laid before

councillors plans of what work

they intend to do this present year.

At a mill on the city's assessment

of fifteen million dollars is at the

proposal of the Suburban Commission

to spend on roads in the county

ending into the city.

Last year the Commission built a

concrete road from St. Catharines

to line on Ontario street, to Port

House.

W. B. Burgoyne, the chairman, who

presented the report, stated that this

year he proposed to spend \$24,500 on

the roads, the Pelham road, three

miles to the county line, for \$11,250;

Niagara street, from the city to the

Shore two and-half mile \$4750,

the Martindale Road from the city

to Lake shore \$4500, with \$2000

for contingencies.

The plan is to build macadam roads

of first which can afterwards form

the foundation for some other mater-

ial as these roads now have a stone

foundation.

It is also proposed, Mr. Burgoyne

stated, to spend \$90,000 on the Mer-

ritton road to the north of the city.

This would be outside the Commis-

sion's spending allowance, and if such

work is undertaken debentures will

have to be issued.

Reeve Revett of Niagara Township

inquired why the road leading into

the city from Niagara on the Lake

was not included in the suburban

road.

The charges arising from the

Mrs. Dempsey to the San Francisco

Chronicle, in which she states the

Dempsey never supported her dur-

ing the war, and that she signed his

draft exemption papers under threat.
