

CRIME IN CANADA.

CRIME IN CANADA.

If the monograph on "Grime in Ganada," recently published by Mr. George Johnson, the Dominion statistician, is a useful and interesting document. The statistics cover a period of eleven years, namely, from 1889 to 1892, inclusive.

A very gratifying evidence of the decrease of orime generally, as indicated by the number of convicted oriminals, is the fact that while in 1882 there was one conviction to every 26 of the pepulation, so that every group of 28 persons would contain on the average, one person who had been convicted of crime or misdemeanor, the size of the group of which this could be said has steadily enlarged until in 1891 the assertion would be true only of a group containing 153 persons.
