

Victory In 400 Metres Makes British Total Imposing Third In Standing

CANADA IS NOW EIGHTH IN RACE

Johnston Increases Dominion Total by Finishing Fourth in 400 Metres.

MAKES NEW RECORD

Olympic Stadium, Colombes, July 11.—Eric H. Liddell, the British flying parson, crowned himself Olympic 400-metre champion this afternoon in the world's record time of 47.3 seconds, defeating Horatio Fitch, United States, who had shattered the previous world's record an hour before in the semi-finals.

The victory of Liddell in the 400-metre run, today's only final event, made the British total an imposing third among the point scores. Canada, which began the day's competition at the bottom of the list of point scoring nations, rose to eighth place through the prowess of Johnston, who came fourth in the 400-metre race and added three points to the Canadian total.

Canada is tied with South Africa in the point score and leads New Zealand.

The point score follows:
United States, 133½; Finland, 103; Great Britain, 69½; Sweden, 24½; France, 13½; Hungary, 7½; Canada, 5½; South Africa, 5; Norway, 4; New Zealand, 4; Denmark, 3½.
D. M. Johnston, Montreal, Rhodes scholar, Oxford, came third in the first heat of the semi-final in the 400-metre race today.

Horatio Fitch, United States, won the first semi-final of the 400-metre run in the Olympic games today with a new world's record for the distance of 47.3 seconds. The old record was 48.1-5 seconds, made by Rudolph in 1912, but lowered one-fifth of a second yesterday by J. Imbach, of the fleet Swiss runner, who did the distance in 48 seconds flat in an elimination heat.

400-metre, second semi-final—E. H. Liddell, Great Britain, first; J. Imbach, Switzerland, second; J. Coak, United States, third; Time, 48.1-5 seconds (equaling old world's record).

Johnston, in the first heat of the 400-metre semi-final contest ran a magnificent race. He was leading right up to the finish, and was then nudged out by Fitch, the United States runner, and Butler, the English crack.

Johnston sprang a sensation on the immense crowd of spectators by beating Engdahl, the Swedish runner, who yesterday forced Imbach of Switzerland, winner of the fifth heat yesterday at dazzling speed.

First Series Figures Show Aces Lead In Team Hitting

Nason, Leading Tec List With .319 Average, Hit Eight Homers and Drove in Thirty-Six London Runs.

London finished third from the cellar, yet the averages for the first series put them at the bottom of the heap. Three places from the bottom in an eight team circuit means quite a bit, and yet the figures don't begin to bear that fact out.

Nason for the first time, according to the figures, leads the team in hitting, being only topped by Connie Fields. Nason, after an awful start, hit for .319, and has driven in three dozen runs. Payne, the big lean Grand Rapids outfielder, is hitting for .413, and has batted in 60 runs.

Peculiarly, the Londoners individually, are hitting around the middle section of the league, Beatty starting it with .285 and Baker cramping five team-mates in between with .246.

If the figures are to be believed, it's been pitching that has bothered the London club. Like most figures, they are capable of many interpretations. Coogan is the only one above the line in pitching. And when it is remembered that he lost two very tough games on the home lot before winning, "The Man from Coogan Bluff" must be reckoned with in the second series. So must the rest on their second series performances.
