Complaint By A Stockholder

Owner of Shares in Dominion Copper Co. on Situation at Greenwood.

Declares Montreal & Boston Has Not Carried Out Its Contract.

From Our Own Correspondent. Greenwood, May 22.—Mining circles in the Boundary are intensely interested in the outcome of the unexpected close down of operations of the Montreal and Boston Consolidated. W. T. Smith, a heavy shareholder in the Dominion Copper Company, which sold to the Consolidated, openly charges that smelting more than to the loss of copper funds and in the accounting of the Dominion under the terms of the bond. He said: "Nearly a year ago the Dominion Copper Company entered into an agreement with the Montreal and Boston Consolidated for the sale of all its properties in the Phoenix camp for \$480,000, being on the basis of fifteen cents per share on 3,200,000 shares of stock. The purchasing company agreed to pay \$12,000 per month and two dollars per ton on all ore shipped from the Phoenix mines, to be settled for every thirty days, and the proceeds to be applied on the bond. So far only \$96,000 have been paid, and no settlement had been made for some 50,000 tons of ore shipped during the past ninety days. In other words, the Dominion shareholders are entitled to the distribution of \$100,000."
