C.F.D. WINS POSTPONED GAME

Exceptionally Fast Game Friday Evening—Score 3-1.

With an even standing in the local league here the C. F. D. and C. N. R. hockey teams met in an exceptionally fine game of ball in which the latter side won by a margin of one run.

The game opened with two thick innings and the close play continued right through. The C. F. D. scored a run in the 2nd inning when an overthrow by a C. N. THOUSAND MILE INSPECTION TRIP

B. M. HILL, Engineer, and Gordon Grant of Can. Highway Com.

A one thousand mile inspection trip over the roads of the province was commenced this morning by B. M. Hill, provincial road engineer, who is accompanied by Gordon Grant, chief engineer of the Highway Commission of Canada, with headquarters at Ottawa. Mr. Hill feels rather enthusiastic over this undertaking and is anxious to show his appreciation to the visitor that the reports about the condition of the roads in New Brunswick are no idle tales and to carry out his intentions to the letter, the whole journey will be made by automobile.

The party left the Royal Hotel this morning at ten o'clock for St. Stephen. From St. Stephen, the itinerary calls for a jump to Fredericton and from the capital the party will go over the road to Chatham. From there they will go to Bathurst, via Carleton Place and then back again. Mr. Hill estimates that it will take the best part of a week to accomplish the journey.

The provincial road engineer declared that the roads of the province are in good shape despite recent rains and the floods during mid-summer. Hon. Peter J. Veniot, the capable minister of public works, has estimated the flood damage in the vicinity of \$200,000 and Mr. Hill practically confirms this estimate. "It is between \$175,000 and \$200,000," he declared this morning. "Yes, despite that, I can say that the roads are in good condition for traffic."

Asked regarding the repairing of the Spruce Lake road, which was badly cut up during the laying of the new water main to the city, Mr. Hill said that the work should be completed within two months time. The New Brunswick Contracting Company have the contract for this work, he said, and he looked for to see them complete it in record time. "I can also say that the Musquash and Lepreau roads will be ready for traffic by the first of September," he announced.

LIQUOR LAW VIOLATORS FINED

Quartette of Notorious Hothead Manufacturers Captured in Early Morning

As the result of assiduous efforts on the part of inspectors H. P. Doyle and Wm. H. Smith a quartette of this county's most notorious hothead manufacturers have been apprehended and convicted. The first of last week this infamous quartette constituted a flourishing home-brew firm but now these four destroyers of good barley and raising are being rotely at anchor in the local harbor for lawbreakers where they are busy trying to think of some healthy friends who will save them from the disagreeable experience of a 30,000 persons as though he had won.
