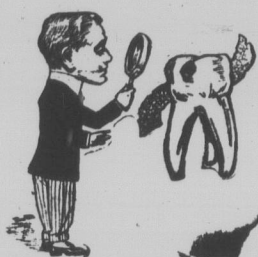

## CORRECTION.

As readers of the Graphic will have noted, two typographical errors appeared last week in our article on the vocational classes. ## Facts and Figures.

Stature as a Racial Test.

## Report on Swim Execution

Places the Discredit Upon

Doyle, One of Hangmen

Recommendation That Executions Should be Held at Central Prisons—Finds that Sheriff Foster Took all Reasonable Precautions

Fredericton, Dec. 5.—Declaring that the "Swim hanging would have been hardly more public if the scaffold had been erected on the street" in laying emphasis upon the unsuitability of conditions at county jails for carrying out executions, the report of J. Bacon Dickson, of this city, who is commissioner appointed by the Attorney-General's Department conducted an investigation into the recent execution of Bonnie Swim, who had to be twice hanged at Woodstock on October 6th before the death penalty had been carried out, was tabled at this morning's meeting of the Provincial Government. The report suggests that the execution should be held at a central prison where they might be under the supervision of a competent and experienced official.

The Commissioner's report blames M. A. Doyle, of Montreal, one of the executioners for the body being cut down too soon after the trap had been sprung the first time. "Nothing was disclosed at the investigation to throw discredit on any other person taking part in the execution," reads one paragraph of the finding, referring to Doyle. Regarding reports that Doyle was drunk or under the influence of liquor, the commissioner says: "I have come to the conclusion that if Doyle had taken any liquor he did not show signs of it in any marked degree on the morning of the execution" and that "it certainly had not affected him

to such an extent as to interfere with his carrying out the execution." Regarding charges that Doyle had been brutal to Swim, the Commissioner finds that the hangman "did not look upon the affair in a proper light" and that Doyle was "not as considerate of Swim's feelings as he might have been," mentioning his remarks on the scaffold to Swim and the springing of the trap while Swim had not finished his prayer.

The report completely exonerates Sheriff Albion Foster of Carleton County from any suggestions of neglect of duty, the commissioner saying: "I am fully satisfied that the Sheriff did all in his power to have a capable man on hand to carry out the execution."

## The Recommendations.

The concluding recommendations of the report follow:

While not a part of my duty, I feel that having been in close touch with the facts regarding this regrettable affair, it would be well for me to deal briefly with our system of capital punishment. The sentence of the court is that the prisoner be hanged by the neck until he is dead. The duty of carrying out this sentence is placed on the sheriff. He receives no instructions from any official source as to how the details of this gruesome task are to be carried out. As our sheriffs have no knowledge of hanging and as no official information is available, they are obliged to secure the services of a professional hangman and this practice has become almost universal in Canada. But the sheriff's difficulties do not end with the decision to employ a professional hangman. There is no official of this description. He must employ some person on the recommendation of others without any responsibility in the matter, and, quite naturally, dependable citizens are not making their living by hanging. The wonder is that there are not more affairs of this nature.
