THE STORY OF THE NUBLE RED MAN OF THE SALT COUNTRY.

The Tipperary Dodge-A River that is Shunned by the Superstitions Savages Drunkenness and Crime. From the Buffalo News.

Aurely becoming extinct on a small reservation, five miles long by three wide, some eight miles south of Syracuse, N. Y. Christian Valley is on one side of the reservation and Cardiff, the little hamlet that became famous as the birthplace of the fraudulent giant who was unearthed in the chemical of the chemical control of the chemical contr 1869, is on the other side. The Onondaga reservation contains at present 9690 acres.

At one time it contained 64,000 acres, but, like the great tribe, it grew small by degrees and beautifully less. Although cividore D. Woolsey and other Americans have lization surrounds them on all sides, it is an undisputed fact that the Onondagas are undisputed fact that the Onondagas are tlers the "Six Nations."

They were composed of the Onondagas, Cayugas, Oneidas, Mowhawks, Senecas and Tuscaroras. At the breaking out of the war for independence the Onondagas, of all the North American Indians, were the only large tribe that espoused the cause of the colonists. All others took sides with Great Britain. The Onondagas remained true to the struggling colonists, and in consideration of their services, soon after the close of the war, were allowed a reservation ten miles square, in the most fertile spot in central New York, and added to that the legislature of New York passed a law allowing the parents of all children under 21 years of age \$50 each for their maintenance. Every few years, by an act of legislature, the tribe is allowed to sell off a few thousand acres of reservation on account of a diminution in numbers.

In 1830 they numbered about 4000; in 1870 nearly 1200, and in 1880 considerably less than 1000. It will only be a few years when the once brave, true and power-fal Onordeages will have completely passed.

Their language they still preserve, and although surrounded by whites, they religiously adhere to their old traditions and ligiously adhere to their old traditions and customs. The green corn ceremonies and dances are as rigorously observed as they were one hundred years ago. Various ministers during the past fifty years have tried to convert the Onondagas to some settled religious convictions, but all to no purpose; the Onondagas will be Indians in every sense of the word. They are more superstitious than the Caffres of southern Africa. Although supremely indolent and thorough-


