TO FORM A NEW GOVERNMENT

STANLEY OF PRESTON SIMMONS THOMPSON AND ABBOTT.

Mr. Thompson had another long interview with Lord Stanley, this time being accompanied by Mr. Abbott. At the conclusion of the interview he made the announcement to the press that his Excellency regarding the formation of a new government, but no decision had been reached.
