The principal amendment suggested was one making it compulsory for every municipality within five days after receiving a registered letter from the board to organize a Local Board of Health and appoint a paid Medical Health Officer and sanitary police, and to provide grounds and buildings for service as an Isolation Hospital.

The board also recommended the appointment of provincial medical inspectors.

Hon. Mr. Harcourt promised the usual "due consideration" of the proposals.

On returning from the Parliament buildings, the board wound up their labors at the Provincial Health offices. They resolved to have printed and circulated a large edition of the pamphlet on cholera, which had been prepared and supervised by the board.
