It may be stated in explanation that tariff schedules A, B, C, D, F, G, H, I, J, L, M and N of the act of 1894, specifically mentioned in section four of the new tariff bill, on which a duty to that imposed by the present law shall be added, are the schedules per-taining to chemicals, earthenware and glassware, metals, manufactures of woods, tobacco, agricultural products, spirits and wines, cotton manu-factures and flax, hemp and jute, silks, pulp, papers and books and lastly sun-
