

ARRAIGN TWO FOR MURDER OF GIRL

Palmer and Binet In Court At Quebec

CARNEAU CASE OPENS

Man Who Saw Crime Committed Is Likely To Testify.

QUEBEC, Oct. 27.—The trial of Frederick K. William Palmer, alias Cole and Rosal Binet, on a charge of being implicated in the murder of Blanche Garneau on the night of July 21, 1920, in Victoria Park, was opened here today. Blanche Garneau was reported as having disappeared on July 21. A week later her body was found in a swamp near the park. The post-mortem examination revealed the fact that she had been violated and strangled. After several adjournments of the inquest, the coroner stated that it was in the interests of justice to render a verdict recommending the authorities to prosecute a vigorous search. Months passed and no clue could be found.

Finally a man named Binet was arrested at Sudbury for the murder, and another man named Palmer, alias Cole, who was at the time a prisoner in the Stony Mountain Penitentiary, Manitoba, was also alleged to have been implicated in the crime. After a delay of several weeks, the men were brought to Quebec, appeared for a preliminary hearing in which Binet stated that the crime had been committed by Palmer, while he, Binet, stood by. Both were then committed for trial to the present criminal assizes.

Palmer claims he can prove he was in Sherbrooke on the day of the murder. However, a statement was recently made by a prisoner named Duval, in Montreal, who declared that he had witnessed the commission of the crime. He is alleged to have stated that he was sitting on a bench in the park at the time, and saw two men attack the girl, brutally beat her and flee. When confronted with Binet and Palmer he stoutly maintained that neither of them had committed the deed.

CIVIL SERVANTS WANT POLICIES ANNOUNCED

Ask Party Leaders to Reveal Attitude Toward the Service.

OTTAWA, Oct. 27.—The Associated Federal Employees of Ontario, Federal Union No. 66, have addressed an open letter to Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighen, Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King and Hon. T. A. Crerar, asking them to outline their respective policies with regard to the civil service in the event of their being returned to office. The questions contained in the letter follow:

If called upon to form the next federal Government of the Dominion of Canada, will you introduce legislation establishing, in the federal civil service joint councils according to the Whitley plan, whereby the important questions of reclassification, reorganization, superannuation, adequate salary schedule, equal pay for equal work, etc., may be so adjusted as to bring about harmonious relations between the civil service and its employees through an efficient and business like administration of the public service.

If called upon to form the next general Government of the Dominion of Canada, will you introduce legislation to place the personnel of the civil service commission under the merit system, so that the commissioners may be chosen by promotion from the ranks of the civil service.

The communication is signed by H. C. House, president of the union, and an early reply is requested.

EGYPTIANS ANXIOUS TO LIMIT PROTECTORATE

Have Been Asking That Troops Be Restricted To Port Said and Suez.

LONDON, Oct. 27.—The Cairo correspondent of The London Times learns from trustworthy sources that the negotiations between Egyptian Premier Adly Yeghen Pasha and the British Government have been conducted on the following basis:

First, in the future, British troops to be confined to Port Said and the eastern zone of the Suez Canal; second, a British controller of the public debt to be appointed; third, Egypt to have the right of diplomatic representation abroad, but in all treaties, save commercial agreements, the British Government to have the right to be consulted; fourth, Alexandria to be a British naval base, with an international police force; fifth, the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan to remain as at present, with the enjoyment of equal rights by both countries and the safety of the Egyptian water supply to be guaranteed. The agreement, if reached, the correspondent adds, will be submitted to the national assembly about the middle of November, when Adly Pasha is expected to return to Egypt.

FOREST FIRES BELIEVED DUE TO BOLSHEVIST PLOT

ROME, Oct. 27.—The forest fires in the vicinity of Vado, which caused a disastrous explosion in the Santa Elena fortress two days ago, is generally believed to be due to a Bolshevist plot, says a dispatch to The Messenger today. The police, however, have been unable to determine definitely the origin of the fires, the dispatch said. Up to midnight last night 22 bodies had been recovered from the wreckage of the explosion and many others, reported missing, are believed to be buried under the debris. Three hundred and fifty injured persons are being treated at hospitals.

COURT FREES TWO.

QUEBEC, Oct. 27.—(Canadian Press Dispatch.)—After deliberating for 25 minutes yesterday afternoon, the jury in the trial of Martinette and Duchesneau, on trial on a charge of manslaughter in connection with the death of Germaine Paige, brought in a verdict of not guilty, and the two prisoners were immediately liberated. Miss Paige was instantly killed at Deschambault, on the Montreal-Quebec highway, on August 5 last, when the car in which she was driving with Martinette and Duchesneau, together with another woman, left the road and ran into a ditch.

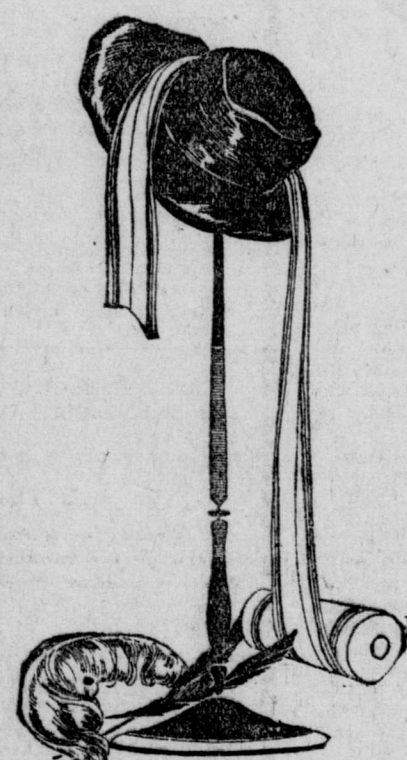
FISHERMEN FIND SKELETON.
